9th Grade Application Process

- 1. Complete your application for admissions online or via hard copy and submit it along with the \$50 application fee.
- 2. Submit the records request form to your current school for your transcript to be sent to us.
- 3. Take the High School Placement Test. If you took the test at a different location, request that your scores be sent to SJHS from that school.
- 4. Once a student is accepted into the freshman class, a \$100 commitment deposit is required by February 1 to reserve their place.

A meeting with the Admissions Committee may be needed prior to an admission decision.

Transfer Application Process

- 1. Complete your application for admissions online or via hard copy and submit it along with the \$100 application fee.
- 2. Submit the records request form to your current school for your transcript to be sent to us.
- 3. Complete the Diocesan Discipline Form and submit it to SJHS after it has been signed and notarized.
- 4. The student and parent must attend an interview with the Admissions Transfer Committee.
- 5. Once a student is accepted to St. Joe's, a \$100 commitment deposit is required to reserve their spot in the class.

Transfer Students are admitted on a rolling admission. Transfers do not need to take the placement test. No transfers are accepted after February 1 for the current academic year.

Scholarships are Available up to \$10,000

The 2023-2024 school year tuition per student:

\$12,200 (Catholic family rate) \$12,500 (non-Catholic family rate)

There is a second child tuition credit of \$500.

SET UP TUITION PAYMENTS

Families may set up monthly tuition payments via FACTS. Tuition must be paid in full by the last day of school.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE IS AVAILABLE!

Financial aid is available and awarded in the form of scholarships, aid, and grants. In order to be considered for financial assistance, families are required to complete a FACTS Grant and Aid form. This application is available in January and requires supporting documentation (income tax return, etc.). In order to be considered for financial assistance, a family must complete and submit a FACTS Grant and Aid form by March 15.




